challenges. However, we have been receiving positive input from all involved. We will be moving forward with the permitting process for a springtime start. Stay tuned!

The SBBA has just purchased benches designed for a coastal environment to be used at public accesses. These benches have been paid for by donations in memory of Lynne Lynch and Lillian Avadonian, known to most residents as "Wing Ding". Look for them at one of the right of ways in the spring.

Get ready for a giant maze of sparkling holiday trees! The Fifth Annual Sea Festival of Trees will be open to the public from Saturday, November 18, through Sunday, December 3, located at The Blue Ocean Event Center on Salisbury Beach. The festival proceeds benefit the Salisbury Beach Partnership's Fund to Bring Back the Historic Carousel. Last year SBBA's tree won Silver Award for Best Beach Theme. Whales @ Salisbury Beach

Beach goers were treated to some great sights for approximately two weeks in early

September. Surfers and paddle boarders could be seen paddling near them as they swam very close to shore. The whales were feeding on Pogies - officially known as menhaden shad. Schools measure in acreage terms rather than numbers. Huge schools can be seen flipping their tails at the surface, moving along with the tidal currents.
